ONE DAY TRIPS

JANUARY

January 25th— Old Capital and Natural History Museums in Iowa City, Iowa. The Old Capital building served as Iowa's first state capitol from 1846 to 1857. In 1976, Old Capitol became a National Historic Land-mark & public museum featuring an educational Discovery Center where you can learn about early Iowans, the Hanson Family Humanities Gallery, and the Keyes' Gallery for Arts. The Natural History Museum houses Mammal Hall, representing the adaptation and diversity of nearly every mammal on the planet, Hage-boeck Hall of Birds displays more than 1,000 specimens, & The Diversity of Life exhibits lining the ground floor describe the major plant and animal groups, as well as the art of taxidermy. 9 am-3 pm \$54.00

FEBRUARY

February 29th—Fun City in Burlington, IA. FunCity features many attractions to enjoy! FunCity's Arcadium includes more than 100 inter-active arcade games including a 3D flight simulator. Try indoor go kart racing on the 25,000 square foot ZOOM indoor speedway features electric go-karts. Head on over to Lazertown—A 2,500 sq. ft. laser tag arena, in which up to 8 players can battle together or in separate games. 9 am-3:30 pm \$66.00

March 18th—Miller Park Zoo in Bloomington, IL. The Miller Park Zoo offers many exhibits. Highlights include: reindeer, Sumatran tiger, greater flamingos, river otters, red pandas, lemurs, Galapagos tortoise, bald eagles, Pallas' cat, snow leopards, gibbons, and red wolves. WHO CAN ATTEND

All events are open to individuals with developmental or intellectual disabilities who are 18 years of age or older. Individuals must be able to be independent in self-care, and able to travel in a staff to individual ratio of 1:5. Interested individuals who require more support/assistance than 1:5 should contact The Arc of the Quad Cities Area for more information.

COST & REGISTRATION

The cost of each Community Event is listed in the corresponding event description. Transportation is not included. Special transportation arrangements are available for an additional charge. Reservation must be made at least 1 week prior to event.

The cost of each Day Trip is listed in the corresponding trip description. Payment for Day Trips due at time of registration. Price of trip includes admission. Meals not included unless stated. Reservation must be made 1 week prior to event. Day Trips range

from 6-14 hours in length, generally leaving early or mid morning and returning in the evening. All Day Trips will depart from and return to The Arc Opportunity Center at 5101 52nd Ave., Moline, IL.

Trips may be cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances such as inclement weather, schedule changes by venue, & availability of event tickets.

All trips are being offered at a reduced rate to individuals without state or local funding thanks to a grant from the United Way of the Quad Cities Area.
